Statement from the Chairman of the Board

Airdrie is now a city of greater than 80,000 residents and your Airdrie Public Library (APL) is rising to the challenge of serving a historic record number of patrons. There are many challenges to overcome when a community experiences such rapid growth, but I'm pleased to report that your APL Plan of Service has anticipated these needs. One element of the plan that is particularly geared towards our growing population is the goal of celebrating diversity and cultural awareness. Your library is focused on providing opportunities to help increase the community's under-

standing and appreciation of Airdrie's diversity, as well as celebrating the heritage of its people. This is an exciting and important goal in place-making and creating an environment where all are welcomed, and all feel a sense of belonging.

APL continues to make strides towards other broad strategic goals, such as helping patrons understand how to find, evaluate, and use information; connecting patrons and Airdrie residents with community resources and services; and, significantly in our very young and family-oriented community, creating young readers by focusing on early literacy. Although limited by a facility that is bursting at the seams, the citizens of Airdrie continue to access library materials and programming at ever-increasing rates – this is a credit to the fine work being done by the world-class staff at APL!

We are already quite far down the road towards breaking ground on the new multiuse facility and library in Airdrie, and your Airdrie Public Library Board of Trustees sincerely looks forward to celebrating many new milestones in this project with members of the community over the coming months.

Statement from the Library Director

APL programmers celebrated the return to post-pandemic programming by creating a range of exciting new offerings. Library programs in 2022 included ASL storytimes, an LGBTQ2S+ book club, and "design our future library" programs in LEGO, Tinkercad and Minecraft. The more than 1,000 children and caregivers that attended APL's annual Mighty Machines fair in September gave clear indication that the community was ready to come back to the library in droves.

INNOVATION



2022 saw the introduction of APL-owned e-books. Previously, all e-books available to Airdrie patrons were owned by the Marigold Library System or available for loan to Airdronians through sharing agreements with other Alberta libraries. Thanks to the generous support of the Advocates of the Airdrie Library, the John and Peggy Graham Fund for Early Literacy, The Kiwanis Club of Airdrie Foothills, and the Rotary Club of Airdrie, APL now owns more than 2,500 e-titles (and growing).






■ City of Airdrie: Operating
