Statement from the Chairman of the Board

It would be an understatement to say that 2020 was a year full of unexpected challenges. The global pandemic put a stop to a significant proportion of library programming for most of the year. While we were pleased to be able to continue offering services such as online programming, interlibrary loans and curbside pickups, I know our library staff misses interacting with Airdronians on a daily basis.

Our guiding document for library services is our Plan of Service. Under normal circumstances, the Board of Trustees creates this Plan of Service on a three year cycle. 2020

was to be the last year of the current plan of service, but the disruption posed by the pandemic caused us to interrupt progress on several of our service goals. This has prompted us to take the unusual step of extending the Plan of Service goals for one additional year, giving everyone time to get vaccinated and create the conditions where we can consult with the community later in 2021 on a new three-year Plan of Service that will start in 2022.

We look forward to the day where we can reopen our doors to the community and get library programming and services ramped up back to normal. 2020 was an exceptional year and one that, it's safe to say, everyone is eager to put behind them. Your Library Board looks forward to 2021 and the major steps that will be taken this year alongside Airdrie City Council to plan for a new library facility.

Statement from the Library Director

APL was mandated shut twice by Alberta Health Service in 2020. During the first closure from March 17-July 5, APL's collection was inaccessible and interlibrary loan was completely suspended. Most of APL's public service staff were laid off.

Limited curbside pick-up began in June. From July to mid-December, the library's main facility was open to the public under strict pandemic safety protocols. On December 13, the library was once again ordered shut. This time interlibrary loan remained active and Airdrie patrons were able to access books from both our own collection and those of other libraries.



Curbside pickup was so brisk the library recalled staff that had been sent home in a second temporary layoff.

Library service measures were profoundly impacted by the closures. Circulation, especially circulation of digital materials, was much higher than we anticipated, but in-person visits plummeted. Live programming was offered in the first quarter of the year but suspended entirely for the remaining nine months. Virtual programming, however, became one of APL's 2020 successes.

It took exactly two and a half weeks for the library's programming department to move to home-based work, learn to create and produce online programs, and implement a process for mounting video programming for all ages on YouTube, accessible through the APL website. There has never been a better example of how nimble and creative APL can be when faced with a challenge.

Children's programming attendance increased 43%.

Digital downloads increased 40%.

Attendance at the new online programs was high, with 22,948 participants in 597 virtual programs.








Revenue 2020
