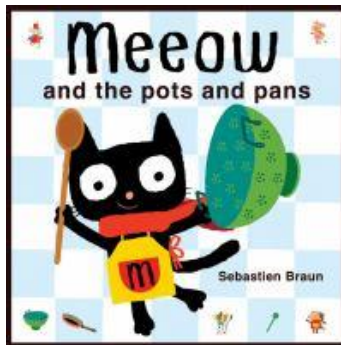


**Giraffes Can't Dance**

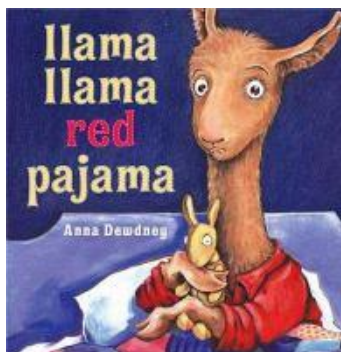
**Meow and the Pots and Pans**

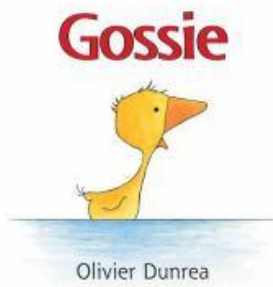
**From Head to Toe**

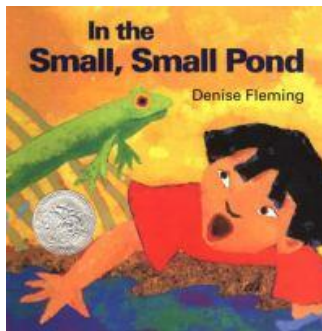
**Llama, Llama Red Pajama**

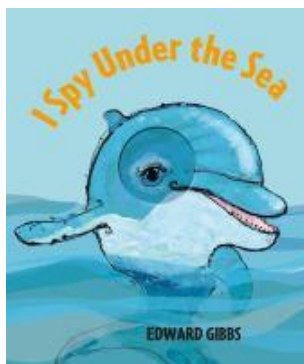
In a Small, Small Pond

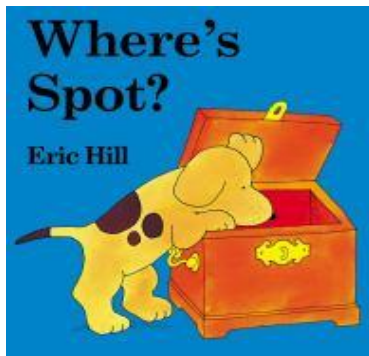
I Spy Under the Sea

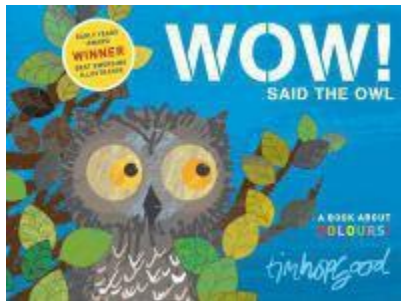
**My Heart Fills with Happiness**

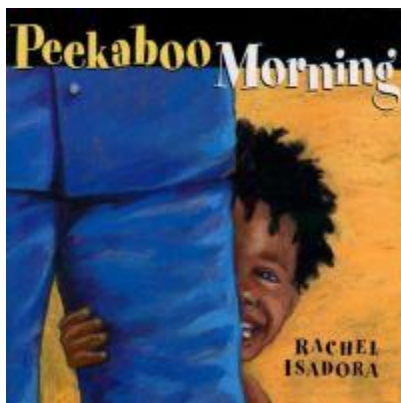
**Where's Spot?**

Already available in board book format, this very first Spot book now has a brand-new cover in a fresh, vibrant color that makes it jump off the shelf.



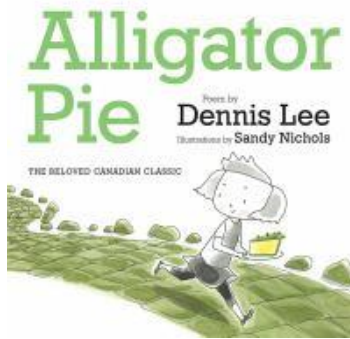
**Wow! Said the Owl**

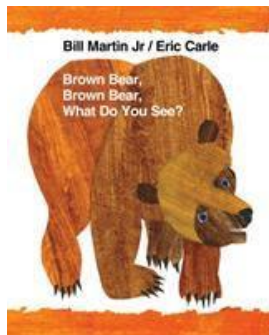
**Peekaboo Morning**

Join this sweet toddler in the morning fun, sharing words your baby can repeat and pictures your baby will recognize. Then find out what this toddler sees next. It could be you!



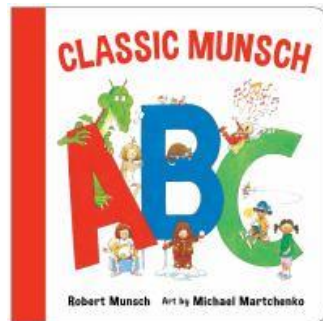
Alligator Pie

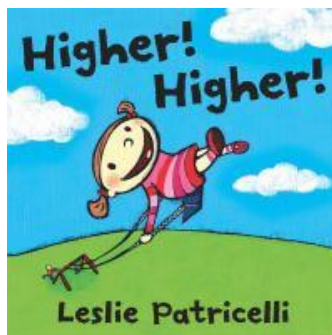
Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?

By Munsch, Robert

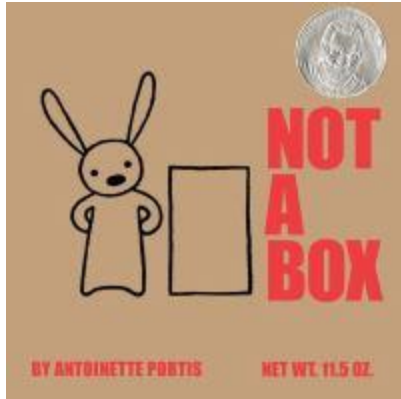

By Patricelli, Leslie

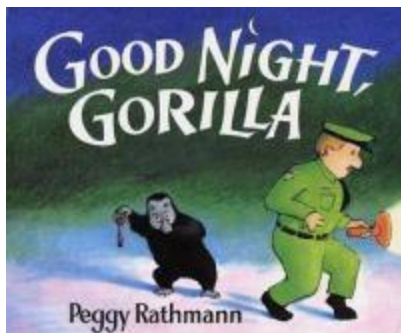

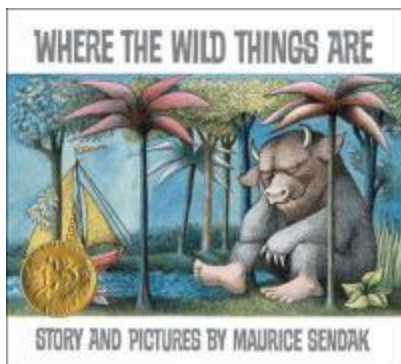
Goodnight, Gorilla

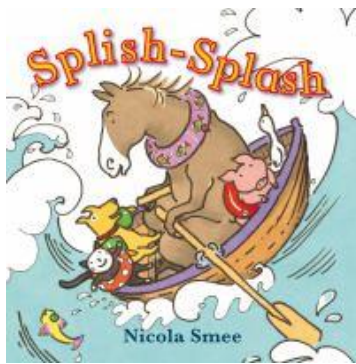
We're Going on a Bear Hunt

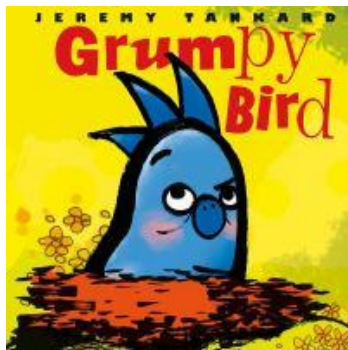
Where the Wild Things Are

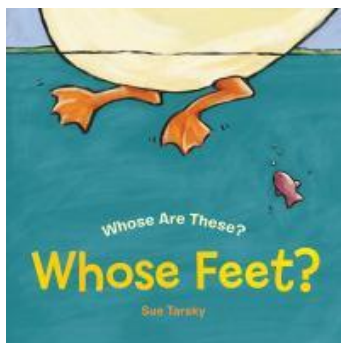
Splish-Splash

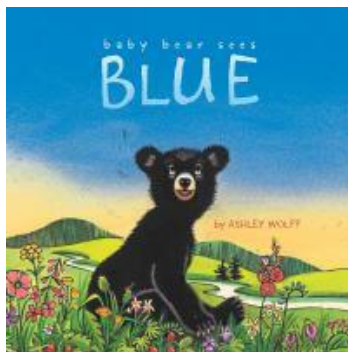
Grumpy Bird

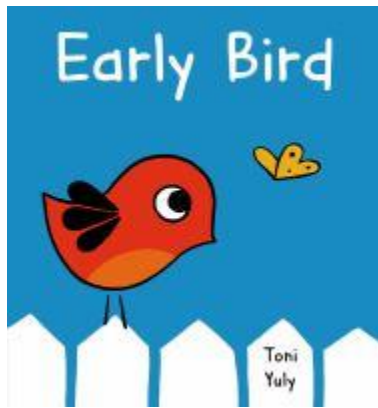
Whose Feet?
